For collections available for homework or reading skill development and maintenance, including *Tumblebooks* for children, download to your SMARTboard and share with the entire class.

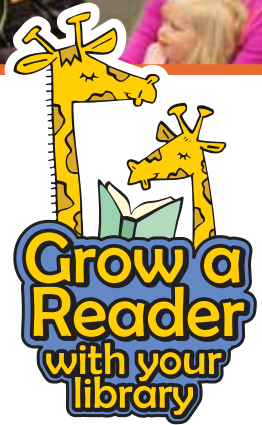

# Middle and High School Classes

## **Café Book**

CRRL instructors partner with school librarians to facilitate book discussion on a selection of current teen literature. ## **Teen Art Show**

Students demonstrate creativity and artistic talent, and learn exhibition skills, by submitting their work for a month-long exhibit at the Headquarters Library. Students in grades 11 and 12 also develop critical evaluation skills by judging the work of younger participants. **Grades 9–12 only.**

## **Teen Poetry Contest**

Students clarify, extend, or elaborate on ideas using vivid language such as imagery, figurative language, and sound elements by creating and submitting original poetry.
