What are your goals for the library's future?


To continue to reach out to our diverse community. I get a thrill every time I spot a Library on the Go van on the road.


As a trusted voice within the community, the library seems a natural partner for the U.S. Census.

Beginning in March, every household in America will receive a postcard with instructions for taking the Census online or by phone in several different languages. Starting in May, Census takers will visit in-person households that haven't had a chance to respond yet.

EVERYONE

How is my information kept safe?

By law, the Census Bureau is required to keep the information it collects confidential, even from other government agencies. Only statistical information is released, such as population counts.

Who gets counted?

Everyone living in your household as of April 1. This includes infants, extended family, and nonfamily living in your residence. Do not count college students living in dorms, as they will be counted where they are.

Why is the census important?

The results are used to determine how much funding local communities receive for key public services and how many seats each state gets in Congress. State and local officials also use census counts to draw boundaries for congressional, state legislative, and school districts.

How can I get involved?

Engage with your local Census Bureau representative at our Civic Labs, which are informal lobby tables designed to spark conversation.
