




Big Library Read

This year's Big Read ran from June 28-July 12, and **177 customers** checked out S.F. Kosa's *The Quiet Girl*.












Children's titles about the Declaration of Independence and the colonial leaders who wrote and signed it.







Lobby Stops

On July 1, CRRL resumed Library on the Go van services, making scheduled visits to targeted communities in the CRRL service area, including assisted living facilities and senior apartments. At these residential facilities, the library brings browsing materials and requested items inside to customers, tailoring selection and services to these special audiences.







On September 1, CRRL began offering a new platform for **homework help** through **Brainfuse's HelpNow**, a live tutoring and studying resource provided by the Library of Virginia. HelpNow will replace tutor.com, which CRRL had been paying for out of our operating budget.




Library of Virginia Subgrant









CRRL has applied for, but not yet received, \$96,000 apportioned by the Library of Virginia from ARPA funding through the Institute of Museum and Library Services. These funds will be used to help fulfill our database and eMaterials budgets.



Up and Comer Award





Access Services Librarian Babak Zarin has been awarded the <u>Virginia Library</u>
<u>Association's</u> Up and Comer Award.

This award recognizes a librarian who shows leadership early in their career. Zarin received his Master of Sciences in Library and Information Sciences from the Catholic University of America in 2019 and became CRRL's Access Services Librarian in July of that year.



Public Relations:

- Appointed to two year PLA Public Library Advisory Committee
- Completed committee service on the Library of Virginia's Emergency Planning Workbook Committee
- Serving a second year as RUW Local Government Campaign Chair for 2021
- Participated in the Library of Virginia's Focus Group on Publicity and PR
- Attended 6 Lead Virginia 2021 classes
- Presented to Rappahannock Rotary Club's Satellite Club
- Presented to Fredericksburg Regional Chamber of Commerce on workforce development
- Participated in Fredericksburg Regional Chamber of Commerce Leader2Leader Podcast



Public Relations (continued):

- Updated website for easier customer discovery of key resources
- Partnered with Friends of the Library President on booksale
- In July, promoted awareness of branches being open with a radio ad (42 broadcasts), 2 Free Lance-Star print ad sets (front-page takeover and full back page) and digital ad, Westmoreland News print ad, and email blast via Fredericksburg Parent newsletter.
- Seven press releases sent to local media outlets
- Communicated with county and city officials on impact of the expiration of the State of Emergency



Organizational Development:

- Fredericksburg Branch second floor shelving renovations completed and now dedicated only to children and teen services
- Computer lab renovations at Fredericksburg Branch and upgrades to new children/teen programming room are nearly complete
- Upgrades to all three Westmoreland Branches will begin soon
- Landscaping upgrades at Newton Branch completed
- Working towards hours expansion at four locations and reopening of Fried Center on September 7
- Continued work on new Comprehensive Technology Plan



Library Administration:

- Held meeting with all library leaders system-wide to discuss Employee Survey results and next steps.
- Employees elected to attend Employee Survey discussion groups; 24 employees attended three meetings.
- Implemented use of the hiring platform of current payroll software to more efficiently fill vacancies both internally and externally; hiring is ongoing.
- Communicated Policy Manual changes approved at June Board meeting to all staff as well as any resulting Employee Handbook updates.
- Upgraded internal staff wiki to new platform



Financial Management:

- Scheduled annual audit for September
- Met with budget team to discuss possible adjustments related to the receipt of less than full funding and to bring requested adjustments to the FY22 budget to the September Board meeting.
- Met with budget team to create proposed FY23 budget using goals approved by Board. Worked with team to create additional options due to a resulting larger than anticipated increase for the jurisdictions.
- Applied for ECF and ARPA federal funds
- Implemented the board approved 1.5% retroactive FY21 COLA as well as the 2.5% COLA that went into effect on July 1



Board Relationship:

- Emailed 7 updates to the Board since our last meeting on June 14
- Met with the Board Chair to finalize the agenda for the September 13th meeting
- Maintained frequent contact with Board Chair
- First Library Board retreat was held on July 23rd and was very productive with detailed presentation from our Leadership team
- Invited Community Relations Manager to attend September Board meeting to present on CRRL's public relations efforts
