# Director's Goals: Accomplishments June - August



## Public Relations:

- Appointed to a two-year term on the PLA Leadership Advocacy Committee
- Attended ALA annual conference in DC, along with 9 members of library leadership
- Attended the Fredericksburg Regional Chamber of Commerce First Responders Appreciation Breakfast
- Met individually with several county supervisors and the new Stafford County Administrator
- Continued service on the *Public Libraries* Advisory Council
- Continued service as Chair of the Rappahannock Goodwill Industries Board of Directors
- CRRL's Adult Services Coordinator, Tracy McPeck, accepted into the Chamber of Commerce Leadership Fredericksburg Class of 2023



## Public Relations (continued):

- Completed term on the Local Government Committee for RUW
- Continued service on the Board of Directors of the Fredericksburg Regional Chamber of Commerce
- Conducted multiple interviews with reporters from *The Free Lance-Star* and *Potomac Local News* outlets
- Attended UMW's Leadership Colloquium's Coffee Talks
- Appointed to a three-year term on the Rappahannock Rotary Club Educational Foundation Board
- One staff member joined TRIAD and another staff member joined the National Notary Association.
- Promoted CRRL on Town Talk w/ Ted Schubel monthly; I appeared on August 26th.



## Organizational Development:

- Completed renovations at Montross Branch
- Purchased outside bookdrops for Newton and Montross Branches; this is a first for these locations; all library branches now have outside bookdrops
- IdeaSpace hours increased by 8 hours a week
- Continued meeting and working with Strategic Planner regarding CRRL's new Five-Year Strategic Plan
- Promoted focus groups and survey to CRRL customers
- Promoted community partner survey to the community
- Hosted a professional diversity trainer from the Virginia Center for Inclusive Communities for staff-wide workshops



## Organizational Development (continued):

- Renovations to the Youth Services Programming room at Fredericksburg Branch are complete
- Three privacy pods/telehealth booths have been ordered for the Westmoreland branches using additional ARPA funds.
- Rappahannock Area Regional Adult Education (RARAE) purchased \$1,958 worth of books for Porter's new English Language Learners (ELL) Book Group. The books will become Book Group in a Bag kits that will be available throughout the system.
- Digital news coverage has expanded to include *The Free Lance-Star* and *America's News*, which includes 3,670 U.S. news sources.



## Library Administration:

- 2022 Employee Survey results were reviewed by library leadership, and staff discussion groups met to discuss the results and provide feedback.
- Visited every branch at least once per quarter
- Hired two full-time and 30 part-time staff for vacancies; hiring process continues
- Branches celebrated CRRL's 53rd birthday with pizza provided by the Friends of the Library.
- Accepted City of Fredericksburg's offer to use their stadium suite for a FredNats game and conducted drawing for staff to attend



## Financial Management:

- Annual audit has been scheduled for the week of September 19.
- Received necessary state aid waiver due to reductions in local funding
- Prepared fourth version of the FY23 budget upon notification by the Library of Virginia that CRRL's state aid will be increased by \$112,494, bringing the total to \$875,878, still the highest in Virginia
- FY24 budget wishlist presented to and approved by Library Board at June meeting
- Year-end financial reports prepared for Board Meeting



## Board Relationship:

- Answered Board questions regarding the library app in advance of Special Meeting
- Worked with Chair to plan 2nd annual Board Retreat held in July, including the Strategic Plan board focus group
- Worked with staff to address Board questions and concerns regarding library app
- Maintained regular contact with Board Chair
- Met with Board Chair to finalize agenda for September meeting
- Communicated regularly with entire Library Board


# Expanded IdeaSpace Hours

# Grow a Reader Packs


In July, the library launched Grow a Reader packs to get little readers started with **early literacy skills**.
