Director's Goals: Accomplishments December-February



Public Relations:

- Gave interview to *Potomac Local News* reporter regarding the new strategic plan
- Gave interview to *Potomac Local News* and *The Free Lance-Star* on elimination of overdue fines
- Presented to the Chamber of Commerce Leadership Fredericksburg Class of 2023
- Selected for a second year as Rappahannock Goodwill Industries Board Chair
- CRRL has nominated staff and programs for four VPLDA awards
- Staff continue monthly radio interviews on *Town Talk* with Ted Schubel

- Article on Library of Things collection published on Library of Virginia blog
- Staff participated in three area holiday parades
- Staff contributed \$7,455 to the Rappahannock United Way's Annual Workplace Campaign



Organizational Development:

- Board's decision to eliminate overdue fines incorporated into library policy and procedure
- Telehealth booth for Cooper Branch installed and in use
- Renovations from burst pipes at the LAC, Cooper, and Snow branches have been completed
- Held final meeting with strategic planner
- Presented FY24 budget request to Spotsylvania Board of Supervisors in December
- Focus and emphasis on three main themes from the Employee Survey continue (Compensation, Autonomy, and Stress)
- Attended PLA Leadership Development Committee meetings
- Satellite locations prepared to reopen in March and April



Library Administration:

- Visited all branches at least once this quarter
- Attended the Capital Area Library Directors meeting
- Continued service on *Public Libraries* Advisory Committee
- Staff distributed 5,078 free COVID-19 testing kits to community members
- Staff member proposal to present at VLA's Professional Associates Forum accepted
- Building safety assessments completed by local police departments at 11 library buildings; LAC assessment to be scheduled
- VRSA safety assessments completed at two library buildings; other locations to be scheduled
- Health and retirement benefit webinars shared with staff
- New, streamlined performance review system implemented



Financial Management:

- Annual audit for FY22 has been completed and will be presented by auditor at March 2023 Board meeting
- Attended one meeting with auditor and one with auditor and Board chair
- FY23 spending is on target, and projections are positive, even with a reduced budget
- E-rate funds are expected soon for approximately \$80,000
- The new direct and indirect expenses report, including branches, has been incorporated into FY24 budget request per Board feedback

- Meetings held with both new Stafford County Library Board members
- Met with Board Chair to review March Board meeting agenda
- CRRL Board of Trustees Manual updated and distributed
- Maintained regular communication with Board Chair

As of **January 3**, overdue fines are no longer charged, and all existing overdue fines on customers' records have been waived.






CRRL's Strategic Plan

- Meaningful partnerships






Celebrating African American History



Opportunities for customers to drop by the library to learn about important topics. Recent labs included discussions on:



Privacy Pods


Thanks to a grant from the Institute of Museum and Library Services (IMLS), Westmoreland branches now have privacy pods for:


