

Our ongoing events and programs for winter include fun reading challenges. 

Spotlight on Early Literacy: **Phonological Awareness**

Making sounds is one of the most fun things that our littles do all day--just watch their faces when they make a new sound.

Phonological awareness is about making all of those sounds that will eventually be used to create words. For example, the "t" sound is very different from the "th" sound.

So, let those littles stick their tongues out and explore sounds. To help them, read books that have a lot of rhyming. It is fun, and it allows them to hear the same ending sounds with different letter sounds surrounding it.

Every one of our Grow a Reader classes focuses on an early literacy skill or practice through stories, activities, and caregiver-child interactions.
