Director's Goals: Accomplishments September-November



Public Relations:

- CRRL hosted the Library of Virginia's Library on the Go vehicle in October
- Interviewed by a Free Lance-Star reporter, which resulted in 2 CRRL-related articles
- Book launch of *Rachel's Dream*, by local author Ruth Coder Fitzgerald:
- CRRL received FLS front-page coverage
 - The event was attended by approximately 85 customers at the Fredericksburg Branch
 - Thanks to a Community Foundation grant, CRRL gave out 75 copies of the book to families and teachers



Public Relations: (continued)

- Attended the University of Mary Washington Great Lives opening reception, where CRRL is a partner in the series
- Attended the annual Rappahannock United Way Women United Women of Influence Award Luncheon
- Staff participated in all four local Christmas Parades
- Monthly appearances on *Town Talk* continued; I was on the November 29 show
- Spoke at the *Fredericksburg Advance* digital newspaper ribbon-cutting and had an opportunity to promote CRRL to Rep. Spanberger

- Deputy Director and I are scheduled to meet with the new Westmoreland County Administrator in December
- CRRL hosted staff from Loudoun County Public Library for branch and system tours
- Attended the annual Virginia Public Library Directors Association meeting at the Library of Virginia
- CRRL hosted the VLA Region 5 Library Directors meeting at Porter Branch
- Staff distributed 3,786 free COVID test kits through our partnership with Virginia Department of Health
- Work continues on a lease extension with Cafaro Companies and Spotsylvania County for the Towne Centre Branch

- CRRL also received a \$7,500 Community Grants Fund and \$2,785 from the Northern Neck Insurance Community Grant fund




Story and History

Discovered as an unpublished manuscript written by the late local historian **Ruth Coder Fitzgerald**, **Rachel's Dream** is a juvenile novel about a 12-year-old free African American girl living in 1832 Fredericksburg.

CRRL received a \$3,500 grant from the Community Foundation of the Rappahannock River Region's Virginia

Heritage Fund to edit and publish the book in a multi-year collaboration.





Library Speakers Consortium Author Talks


Virtual author talks from New York Times-bestselling authors and thought leaders represent a wide variety of genres and topics.

- All books count, including books read at storytime, and reading a book over and over counts over and over.




