to serve in the **U.S. Army's famous Buffalo Soldiers**, as portrayed by **storyteller Daisy Howard-Douglas**. The **Patawomeck Indian Tribe of Virginia** is bringing a mobile version of **a traditional indigenous village** to Porter (4/27), Salem Church (5/4), and Fredericksburg (5/18) branches. Two hundred years ago, **Revolutionary War hero the Marquis de Lafayette** toured our region, and we are co-hosting **commemorative lectures and performances throughout 2024** on a variety of related topics, including President James Monroe (4/4) and "La Musique de la Garde Nationale Parisienne, and the Dissolution of the Ancien Régime" (5/2).
