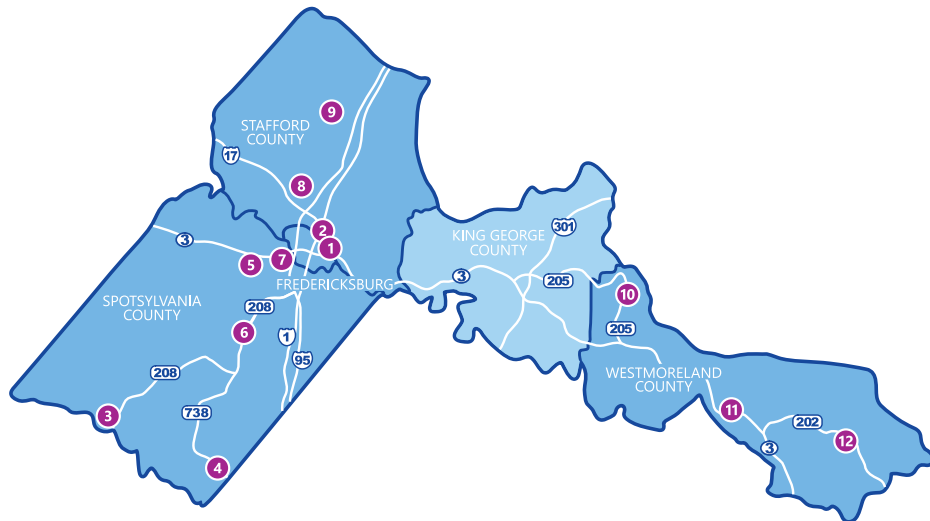


## Teen Stop Motion Video Contest

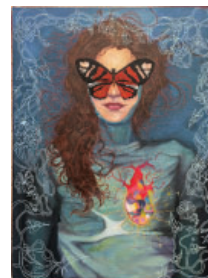

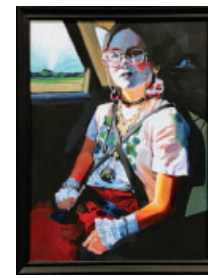
